





Color Key: Cucurbit Carrot Nightshade Brassica Legume Beetroot

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
# Carrot Family - Bed 1 2023 High Peaks Garden

+ Lettuce remaining from 1st grade planting in March. We keep some for students to see it go to seed by the end of the season.



# Cucurbit Family - Bed 2 + Sunflowers

# 2023 High Peaks Garden

+ nasturtiums to repel creatures who like cucurbits and improve growth and flavor of cucumber and squash plants.







## **Planting** Instructions:

#### sunflower

1/4 to 1/2 inch seed depth

interplant with winter squash / pumpkins +/- 10 inches from mounds



## winter squash

1 inch seed depth

spacing: three seeds in each mound\* (mounds spaced 2-3 feet apart)



## pumpkin

1 inch seed depth

spacing: three seeds in each mound\* (mounds spaced 2-3 feet apart)



#### nasturtium

1/2 inch seed depth

interplant with summer squash / cucumbers. Should be +/- 10 inches from other seeds



1/2 to 1 inch seed depth

spacing: 2-3 seeds in each mound\* (mounds spaced 2 feet apart)




#### cucumber

1/2 inch seed depth

spacing: 2 seeds every two feet



\*Each 'mound' of soil should be about 1 foot wide and 4 inches tall.



# Nightshade Family - Bed 3 2023 High Peaks Garden

+ Marigold to deter creatures who like tomatoes







## **Planting Instructions:**

#### potatoes

3 to 4 inch depth

spacing: one potato section every 12 to 18 inches, cut side down, with eyes (sprouts) up



#### tomatoes

(plant start provided)

spacing: one plant +/- every 2 feet



## marigold

(plant starts provided)

spacing: interplant with nightshades, 6 inches away from other plants



## peppers

1 Foot

(plant start provided)

spacing: one plant +/- every 14 inches






Pole Beans require a trellis to climb. Please be sure pole beans are labelled so that Garden to Table's staff knows where to put up the bean trellis.

spacing: one seed every inch




## kale

#### Hello Leah—

Here's wishing you a wonderful planting! Without you, this 2023 3rd grade garden planting wouldn't fly. Thank you so much for all you do as a garden lead.

#### A Few Notes about your Delivery:

Maps: In making your maps each year we pay very close attention to crop rotation—each bed is on a 3-4 year rotation between plant families. In the table below, "CC" stands for Cover Crop. Asterisk denotes a lettuce bed.

Because crop rotation helps with soil fertility and reduces pest and disease pressures, please spend some time before the planting to be certain your map is oriented correctly. Some garden volunteers like to place each page of the map in its corresponding bed for volunteers/teachers/students to easily reference. This is why we print the pages single-sided.

**watering:** Please keep your starts moist (but not soggy) prior to planting. This will prevent transplant shock and make them easier to handle. After planting, please gently water seeds and starts. Our team will more deeply irrigate when we return later in the day. We'll also install tomato cages with protective plastic.

**Trays and Plastic Containers:** We grow our own plant starts in washed/repurposed containers. Please disregard what's written on any stickers attached to pots. Also, please gather up the containers once the planting is finished. We'll take these away to wash and repurpose again next year.

**Leftover Seeds:** Please leave your leftover seeds in the white plastic tub (ideally in a shaded location) for us to pick up after the planting and use for replanting what doesn't germinate. We'll make sure they don't go to waste!
